



Interaction between the physical environment and people – community

The physical environment could <u>create</u> opportunities for crime...

or it could reduce opportunities for crime

It could influence people's behaviour

It could increase or reduce the fear of crime (perceptions)





People (community) should be central to all crime prevention through environmental design interventions.






Understand how people use, or may want to use, spaces Interaction between people and the physical environment











Understand the context – situational analysis

Macro and area-specific realities (poverty, inequality, unemployment)











Involve all role players
A participatory process (e.g. community-driven mapping), partnerships











Combine environmental interventions with other approaches CPTED, law enforcement, social development, LED, etc.





Environmental design interventions, (e.g. CPTED), in combination with other initiatives, could play a key role in area-based interventions
